Scientist is knighted

A top Cambridge scientist went to Buckingham Palace to be invested with a knighthood.

Hugh Pelham, director of the Medical Research Council's Laboratory of Molecular Biology in Cambridge, was knighted in the Queen's Birthday Honours last June.

The investiture took place at the palace yesterday.

Sir Hugh, who lives at Little Shelford, has been director of the lab since 2006, and has been recognised with numerous international awards for his expertise.

He heads a team of more than 500 scientists and staff, and is currently spearheading work on the construction of a new research facility on the Cambridge Biomedical Campus.
